Multi Country Study on the Drivers of Violence Affecting Children

Research Outputs and Field-Friendly Products 2015-2016

The Multi-Country Study on the Drivers of Violence Affecting Children is an on-going, four-country study in Italy, Peru, Viet Nam and Zimbabwe, led by the UNICEF Office of Research - Innocenti and its academic partner the University of Edinburgh. The work has expanded since 2014 to include 10 other UNICEF Country Offices, some who have completed outputs as Research to Policy and Practice Reports (R3Ps) and others are underway.

Our model and approach documented on our website **www.unicef-irc.org/research/274** draws on human-centered design principles, namely in taking an iterative approach to answering the main research questions: **What drives violence affecting children and what can be done about it?**

Shared principles as applied to this study include:

- empowering government counterparts as co-researchers, not passive receptors for policy recommendations;
- collaborating with government statisticians to conduct secondary analyses in-country, not exporting the data or
- outsourcing data analysis to consultants;
- drawing on ethnography and other qualitative research;
- pausing to engage in meaning-making exercises at multiple stages of the research process; targeting specific messages within mixed audiences (aiming to avoid generic recommendations);
- allowing for the time that co-creation requires.
